Meeting Minutes

Minutes for the Friday, December 6, 2024 Meeting

President Larry Mann called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.

- ◆ Treasurer's Report: Karma Roth said that this month's Treasurer's Report includes the activity from October and November, since the October information was not yet available at the last meeting. Because there is not a formal business meeting in January, the activity from December and January will be reported at the February meeting. The Treasurer's Report was approved as presented.
- **♥ VP:** Vice President John DeJong says there is no news about the Swap Meet yet, but we will have the same booth area as last year. He is planning to make space for items that club members want to sell at the booth next year be thinking about what you might want to bring.
- Sunshine: Susie Carnegie sent the cards reported in the Fender Chatter, and also one to Carole Mann who is home recovering from back surgery. Larry has been fixing her dinners, but sadly does not hire out.
- ◆ Safety & Seminars: Mike Robison's safety tip for the month: Don't drive Model T's! They're a hundred years old! You'll die! − No! Drive them! They're a lot of fun! 




