Minutes for the Friday, September 6, 2024 Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:08 by President Larry Mann.

- Treasurer's Report: Was reviewed, motion to approve, passed.
- **Swap Meet:** John DeJong reported on the swap meet. He suggested we could do group sales at the tables in our spot. We had lots of visitors to our booth.
- Sunshine: Susie sent thank you cards to the school houses for the tours.
- Safety: Mike wasn't in attendance, so no report.
- Tours: Nan reports that we had a very busy August.

Karma gave a report on the *Ride in a Model T Tour* – it was well attended – Tom was the most popular with the kids!

Model T Aftermarket Items and Accessories



CLINCHER TIRE BEAD BREAKER TOOL. Made by the J.J. Miller company of Grover Hill, Ohio. I picked this up recently at the Monroe Swap Meet. This is for any vehicle with tires of similar size as the Model T.

Made of cast iron and measures about 20.5 inches in length. Still small enough to put under the back seat with all the other tools. This clincher bead breaker tool has long handles to give extra leverage for separating the tire from the rim. These old tools tend to help and work better than modern tools.

I haven't found an old advertisement for this brand yet, if anybody knows more about these, please let me know.






Club Tours and Goings-On Recap


